The origins of Gdańsk date back to 980. The functions he performed can be seen in the architecture of the old town. Gdańsk was a transport city, thanks to the Motława river flowing through it. Gdańsk is the bigest city of Pomeranian Voivodeship

1924 - The Gdańsk guilder became the currency of the Free City of Gdańsk. In September 1939 it was replaced by the Deutschmark.

- Since the Middle Ages, it has been one of the largest commercial ports on the coast of the Baltic Sea.
- On October 27, 1920, the Conference of Ambassadors to the League of Nations established a new territorial and administrative unit. the Free City of Gdańsk
- Gdańsk was under the rule of German troops for 127 years.



Location:




Długa in Gdańsk is one of the most picturesque and historical streets in Poland. Stretching from the Green Gate to the Golden Gate, it is over half a kilometre long and is steeped in history dating back to the Middle Ages. Beautiful historic tenement houses, representing different architectural styles, create a unique atmosphere.Długa Street turns into Długi Targ, the second important street in Gdańsk, filled with monuments and interesting places.

WESTERPLATTE

Westerplatte - a peninsula was formed in 1845–1847 in Gdańsk at the mouth of the Martwa Wisła into the Bay of Gdańsk.

This is the area of the former Military Transit Depot. It is a symbol of the outbreak of World War II. Polish defenders stationed at the Transit Depot at that time were the first to experience the attack of the Third Reich. Pursuant to the Regulation of the President of the Republic of Poland of August 22, 2003, the "Battlefield of Westerplatte" was recognized as a historical monument. It is a symbol of the prowess and heroism of the Polish soldiers during World War II. Of the many famous battle sites from World War II in Poland, only Westerplatte has retained its original name. The "Westerplatte" Tourist Trail begins at the place where the passenger marina for the "White Fleet" ships is located at the Obrońców Westerplatte Quay and ends at the mound at the foot of the Monument to the Defenders of the Coast, but you can also start the tour from any object. It takes about two hours to complete the entire trail.



House of Artus



Dwór Artusa, also known as the House of Artus, is a historic building in Gdańsk, located in the Old Town, by the Long Market. It is one of the most recognizable places in the city, filled with a rich history and



Construction:

Dwór Artusa was erected in the 14th century, initially serving as a gathering place for merchants in Gdańsk, where trade decisions were made, and various ceremonies were organized. The current form of the building was shaped in the 15th century.

Name:

The name "Artus" is associated with the knight Arthur, a legendary Arthurian hero. Some accounts suggest that the manor could have been a meeting place for both knights and merchants.

Architecture:

Dwór Artusa represents the Gothic style, with a characteristic façade adorned with architectural details, including tracery and sculptures.

Tourist Attraction:

Dwór Artusa attracts tourists due to its architecture and historical significance. Many visitors come here to admire the atmosphere of this historic place.





Olivia Star is 180 meters tall (reaching the highest point of elevation at 156 meters), making it the tallest building in the Tricity area and placing it among the top tallest buildings in Poland.

Location:

Olivia Star belongs to the Olivia Business Centre complex located in the Oliwa district, one of the most prestigious parts of Gdańsk. Oliwa is famous for its green areas, parks and historical cathedral.

Architecture:

Olivia Business Centre consists of several impressive buildings, including tall skyscrapers, which fit into the modern character of the Gdańsk landscape.

Viewpoint:

The top floors of Olivia Star are open to the public from 17 July 2019. At the top of the skyscraper there is an outdoor viewing terrace at a height of 130 m, from which you can enjoy panoramic views of Gdańsk and surrounding areas.

Olivia Garden:

Olivia Garden is a botanical garden located within the Olivia Business Centre complex. In the garden there is an opportunity to see 150 species of plants from 5 different continents. There is also a relaxation area where you can read a book in silence.

Cultural Space:

The complex organizes various cultural events, conferences, exhibitions, concerts with live music and workshops.






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The price of a discount ticket is 18 PLN, and a regular ticket is 23 PLN. It includes access to the observation floor and the Olivia Garden. When buying discounted tickets, it is worth buying them 3 days in advance, as a discount of 30% will be included. From Monday to Friday, from 16:00 and throughout the weekend, access to the Olivia Garden is free.
