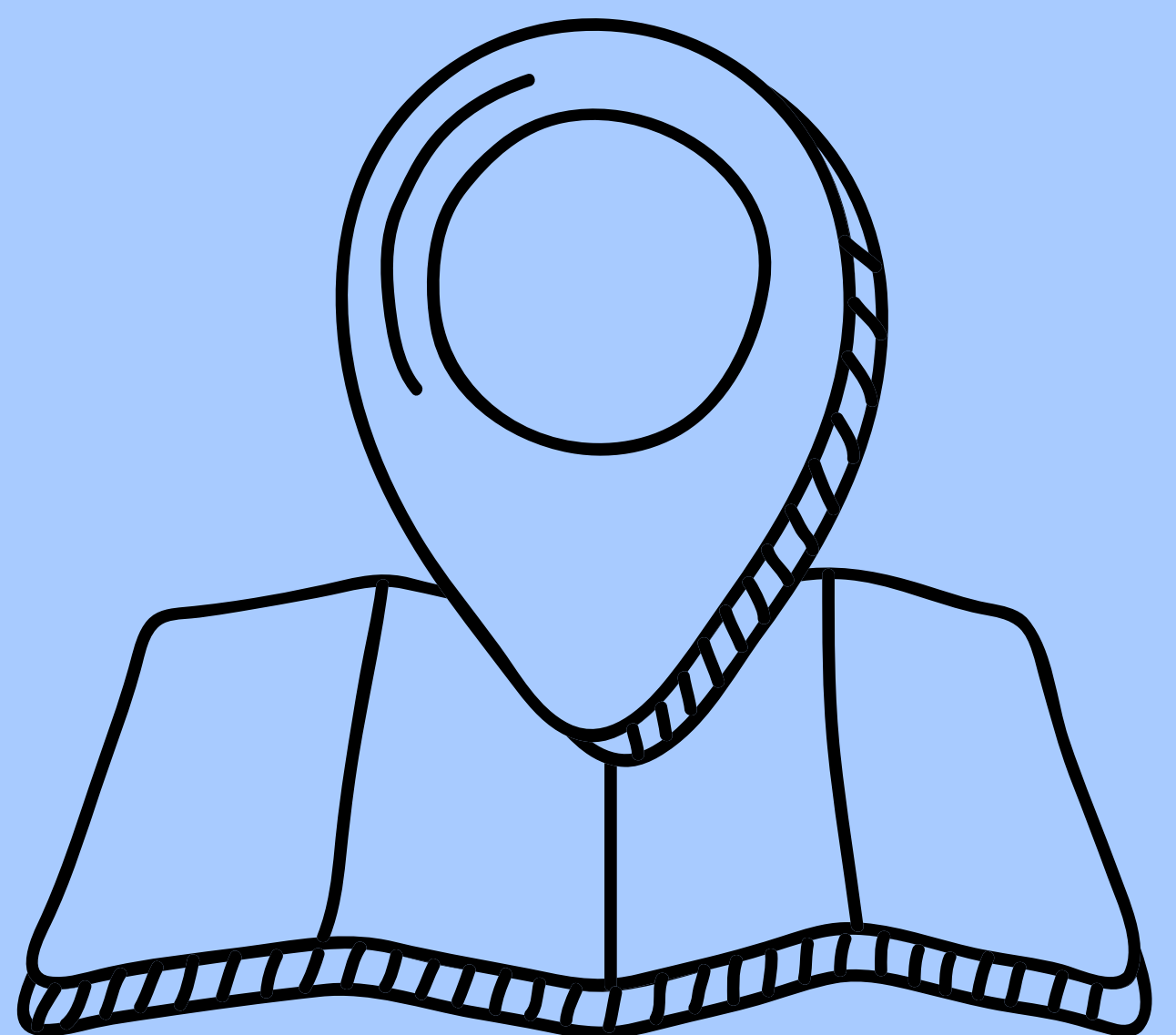

Neptune's fountain



The Fountain of Neptune, symbolizing the God of the Sea with a trident in his hand, has been a symbol of Gdansk since its creation in 1633.

ST. Mary's church



The temple was built in 1343–1502, with a length of 105, 2 m, a width of 66.2 m in the transept, or transverse nave, and a volume of 155 thousand m³. It is the largest brick temple in Europe. It is sometimes called the "Crown of Gdańsk." It is surrounded by 31 chapels. Inside, 26 pillars support the stellar and crystal vaulting, reaching up to 30 meters high.

Museum of Amber



The Museum of Amber displays natural lumps of the resin and its inclusions, as well as finished products, e.g. jewellery, cutlery and chests. The visitor will learn how amber is formed, how it is extracted, what its properties are, and how it has been worked over the ages.

The medieval structure was built in the mid-15th, although there was another crane here before that. The crane could lift up to 4 tons, and was also used as a mast erector. It is proof that the Gdansk skyline has had Cranes since the 14th century.

The primary task of the World War II Museum is to disseminate knowledge about World War II, to show the Polish perspective on the greatest conflict in the history of mankind, to cultivate the memory of the victims of totalitarian systems and heroes of the struggle for freedom of many nationalities.

Westerplatte

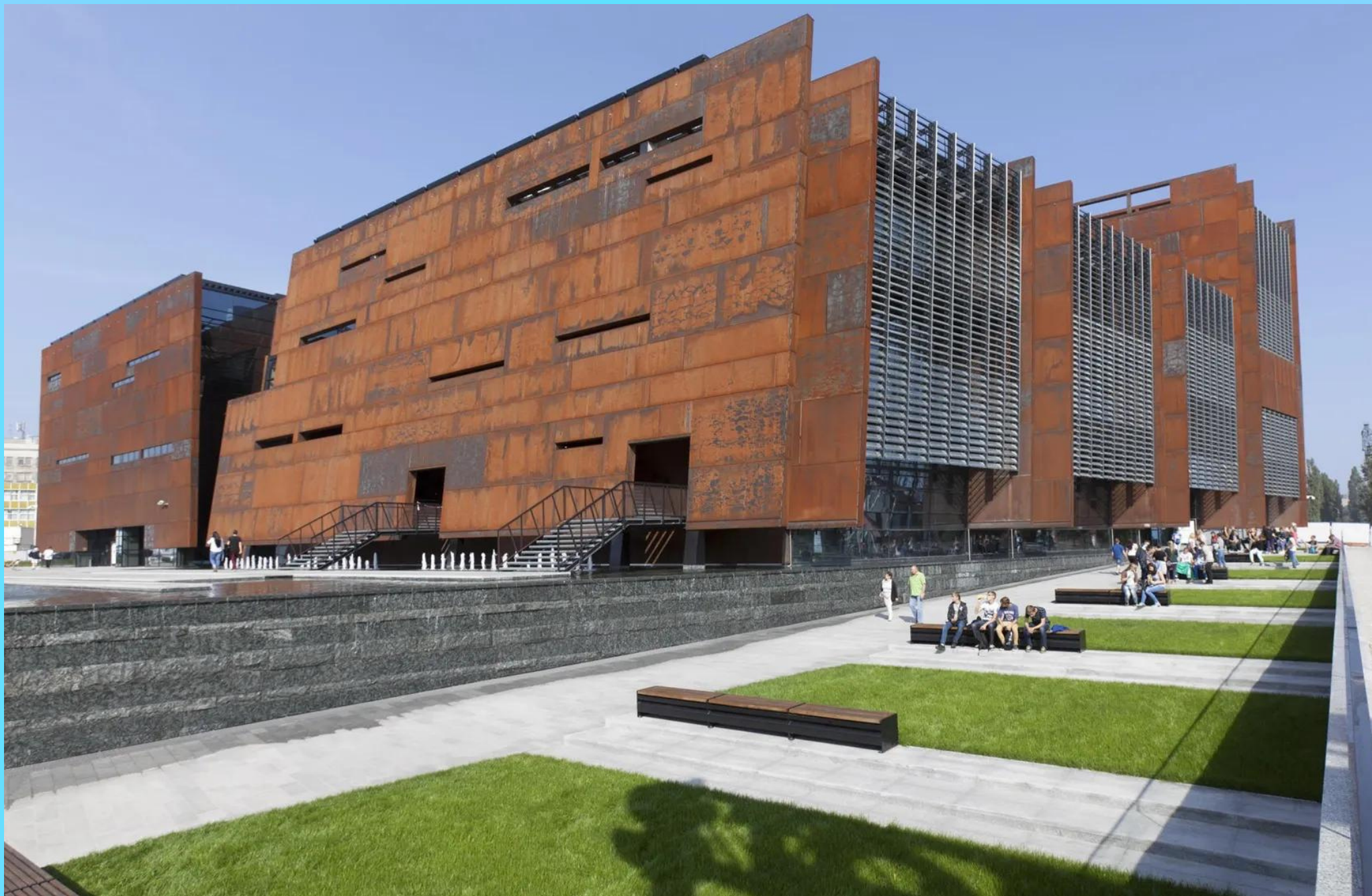


it is famous for the Battle of Westerplatte, which was the first clash between Polish and German forces during the invasion of Poland and thus the beginning and the first battle of World War

The museum commemorates the revolution of Solidarity and the fall of communism in Europe.

Gdańsk shipyard



Gdansk Shipyard is one of the oldest and longest-operating industrial plants in Pomerania. It is a large Polish shipyard, located in Gdansk. The shipyard gained international fame when Solidarity was established there in September 1980. It is located on the western side of the Dead Vistula River and on Ostrow Island.

Curiosity

The Gdansk Shipyard is often the venue for various events, such as concerts, party the opening of the summer season and trade fairs. You can also go there to eat, the area is called Food Hall.
